Results

- NWU 35% not performing well
 - 14 dropped out + 43 Continued = 57 students
- NMU 53% not performing well

13 dropped out + 13 changed course + 34 Continued +14 Still registered = 74 students

- 1st year Registered students repeating students included?
- Graduates repeating students included?
- Drop out vs changing qualification
- Carry out modules in some institutions (skewed results)
- Graduation year for institutions
- Completion period to be clear

Conclusions

- Relatively low throughput rates in most institutions
- The number of students registered is low
- Demographics (race) differ markedly in certain institutions
- Gender in student population is predominantly female

- Standardize the collection of data for student intake and throughput
